Galapagos Investigator

Workshops for KS2 pupils
led by Sarah Langford.
Erasmus Darwin House, Lichfield.
Mondays 7th, 14th, 21st, 28th November 2011

Sarah Langford is an experienced KS2 Science teacher and a photographer. She has spent time on the Galapagos, the islands where Charles Darwin found much of the evidence to support his theory of evolution.

Using resources which she produced following her visits to the Galapagos, Sarah has devised these workshops, which have already been well received by KS2 pupils and teachers. Guided by Sarah, children explore the themes of **colonisation, natural selection, and adaptation**. The activities are closely linked to the KS2 Science curriculum.

Tortoise Workshop: pupils do activities on colonisation and adaptation, and Sarah also introduces the topic of natural selection; 9.30am-11.30am or 12.30pm-2.30pm; £3 per pupil.

Iguana Workshop: pupils do extended activities on colonisation, adaptation, and natural selection; duration full day consisting of 2 sessions, each of two hours, with a break in between; £6 per child. Erasmus Darwin House has room for children to eat lunch.

We can accommodate approximately 30 children, and we require you to bring with you at least one teacher (or other responsible adult) for every ten children.
Make your booking as soon as possible to reserve a place for your school!
